



Matthew 13:12-21 NLT

Five Thousand




13 As soon as Jesus heard the news,  
He left in a boat to a remote area to be alone.  
But the crowds heard where He was headed  
and followed on foot from many towns.






**15 That evening the disciples came to Him and said,

and two fish!” they answered.**


**18 “Bring them here,” He said.**

who distributed it to the people.

## Matthew 26:26

26 While they were eating, Jesus took some bread,  
and after **a blessing**,  
He broke it and **gave it to the disciples**,  
and said, "**Take, eat; this is My body.**"



## **2 Kings 4:42–44 Prophet Elisha**

**42 Now a man came from Baal-shalishah,  
and brought the man of God bread of  
the first fruits, twenty loaves of barley  
and fresh ears of grain in his sack.**

**And he said,**

**“Give them to the people that they may eat.”**

43 His attendant said,  
“What, will I set this before a hundred men?”  
But he said,  
“Give them to the people that they may eat,  
for thus says the LORD,  
‘They shall eat and have some left over.’ ”

44 So he set it before them,  
and they ate and had some left over,  
according to the word of the LORD.

## **2. He's a God of miracles.**

- 20 They all ate as much as they wanted,  
and afterward, the disciples picked up  
twelve baskets of leftovers.
- 21 About 5,000 men were fed that day,  
in addition to all the women and children!



1. The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want.  
He makes me lie down in green pastures.
2. He leads me beside still waters.  
He restores my soul.
3. He leads me in paths of righteousness  
for His name's sake.
