








Genesis 12:9-20 NLT “Beauty and the Beast”

- 10 At that time a severe famine struck the land of Canaan, **forcing Abram** to go down to Egypt, where he lived as a foreigner.




"I now know thee, thou clear spirit,

because of their interest in you.”





- 18 So Pharaoh summoned Abram and accused him sharply.
“What have you done to me?” he demanded.
“Why didn't you tell me she was your wife?

19 **Why did you say**, ‘She is my sister,’

Now then, here is your wife.
Take her and get out of here!”

20 Pharaoh ordered some of his men
to escort them,
and he sent Abram out of the country,
along with his wife and all his possessions.
