- 26 After Terah was 70 years old, he became the father of Abram, Nahor, and Haran.
- 27 This is the account of Terah's family.
 Terah was the father of Abram, Nahor,
 and Haran; and Haran was the father of Lot.

- 28 But Haran died in Ur of the Chaldeans, the land of his birth, while his father, Terah, was still living.
- 29 Meanwhile, Abram and Nahor both married.
 The name of Abram's wife was Sarai,
 and the name of Nahor's wife was Milcah.
 (Milcah & her sister Iscah
 were daughters of

Genesis 12:1-8 NLT "The Call of Abram"

1 The LORD had said to Abram,

"Leave your native country, your relatives, and your father's family, and go to the land that I will show you.

- #1 I will make you into a great nation
- #2 I will bless you
- #3 and make you famous,
- #4 and you will be a blessing to others.
- #5 I will bless those who bless you
- #6 and curse those who treat you with contempt.
- #7 All the families on earth will be blessed through you."
